

### **Resident survey results**

The last Rushmoor Borough Council residents' survey was carried out in 2018 with 1,046 surveys returned. The survey was an online survey and we know that 46 residents in Cherrywood ward filled in the survey. Below is a summary of the results for Cherrywood ward.

# Satisfaction with Rushmoor (Aldershot and Farnborough) as a place to live (with 1 being very dissatisfied and 10 being very satisfied)

The top factor from the respondents from Cherrywood ward to making somewhere good to live is affordable decent housing, this is different to the respondents from Farnborough and all the respondents to the survey, who indicated that the level of crime was the top factor.

# Satisfaction with Rushmoor Borough Council (with 1 being very dissatisfied and 10 being very satisfied)



- **Population:** Cherrywood ward has a population of approximately 8200, which accounts for about 8.7% of the population of Rushmoor.
- **Age:** Cherrywood has a slightly younger population (43.7% aged 0-29 years of age) than Rushmoor as a whole (40.2% aged 0-29 years of age).



 Housing: A higher percentage of residents in Cherrywood live in homes rented from social landlords (housing associations) and less own their own homes, compared with Rushmoor as a whole.



• **Economic Activity/Inactivity:** Cherrywood ward had less full time workers, and slightly more unemployed residents, and students and more long-term sick or disabled when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.

 Qualifications: A higher percentage of Cherrywood residents have no qualifications and other qualifications, and a lower percentage have the highest level of qualifications, when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.



Level 1 qualifications cover: 1.4 O Levels/CSE/GCSEs (any grades), Entry Level, Foundation Diploma, NVQ level 1, Foundation GNVQ, Basic/Essential Skills.

Level 2 qualifications cover: 5+ O Level (Passes)/CSEs (Grade 1)/GCSEs (Grades A\*-C), School Certificate, 1 A Level/ 2-3 AS Levels/VCEs, Intermediate/Higher Diploma, Welsh Baccalaureate Intermediate Diploma, NVQ level 2, Intermediate GNVQ, City and Guilds Craft, BTEC First/General Diploma, RSA Diploma.

Level 3 Qualifications cover: 2+ A Levels/VCEs, 4+ AS Levels, Higher School Certificate, Progression/Advanced Diploma, Welsh Baccalaureate Advance Diploma, NVQ Level 3; Advanced GNVQ, City and Guilds Advanced Craft, ONC, OND, BTEC National, RSA Advanced Diploma.

Level 4 and above qualifications cover: Degree (BA, BSc), Higher Degree (MA, PhD, PGCE), NVQ Level 4-5, HNC, HND, RSA Higher Diploma, BTEC Higher level, Professional Qualifications (Teaching, Nursing, Accountancy).

• **Health:** Cherrywood ward has a slightly lower percentage of residents stating they are in very good health, when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.



### **Deprivation breakdown**

The Government's Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2019 provides a relative deprivation score for each small area in England, it covers a range of economic, social and housing issues. The overall score is calculated using data from seven domains. Most of indicator data has come from 2015 and 2016 and some of the data is from the 2011 Census. The Indices of Deprivation cover geographical areas that are called Lower-layer Super Output Area level (LSOA), of which there are 32,844 in the country. There are a total of 58 LSOAs in Rushmoor.

Unfortunately, LSOAs and the council's wards do not exactly line up. In Cherrywood ward there are all or part of eight LSOAs. The following map shows the number of the LSOAs in Cherrywood ward and the approximate percentage of the LSOA in the ward. Each LSOA is ranked, where 1 is the most deprived and 32,844 is the least deprived.

LSOA 119 is in the 20% most deprived areas in England for Multiple Deprivation and for the Income, Employment, Education, Skills and Training, Health Deprivation and Disability, Crime and Barriers to Housing and Services domains. LSOAs 120 and 122 are in the 20% most deprived areas for the Education, Skills and Training domain. LSOAs 105, 120 and 103 are in the 20% most deprived areas for the Crime domain. LSOAs 105, 104, 106 and 103 are in the 20% most deprived areas for Barriers to Housing and Services domain.
