

## **Map of Manor Park**

Manor Park covers the area in Aldershot surrounding the park, from the railway line in the west continuing up Grosvenor Road, and the High Street in the North and to Lower Farnham Road in the south east.



## **Resident survey results**

The last Rushmoor Borough Council residents' survey was carried out in 2018 with 1,046 surveys returned. The survey was an online survey and we know that 115 residents in Manor Park ward filled in the survey. Below is a summary of the results for Manor Park ward.

## Satisfaction with Rushmoor (Aldershot and Farnborough) as a place to live (with 1 being very dissatisfied and 10 being very satisfied)

Respondents from Manor Park ward have a higher satisfaction with Rushmoor as a place to live than the respondents from Aldershot but a lower satisfaction than all respondents to the survey.

#### Top factor in making somewhere good to live

The top factor from the respondents from Manor Park ward to making somewhere good to live is shopping facilities, this is the same all the respondents to the survey but different from the respondents from Aldershot, who indicated shopping facilities as the top factor.

#### Top factor that needs improving in the local area

The top factor from the respondents from Manor Park ward that needs improving the most is road and pavement repairs, which is the same as the respondents from Aldershot but different from all the respondents to the survey, who indicated road and pavement repairs was the top factor.

# Satisfaction with Rushmoor Borough Council (with 1 being very dissatisfied and 10 being very satisfied)







 Housing: A higher percentage of residents in Manor Park rent their homes from private landlords, and less rent their homes from social landlords (housing associations), when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.

• **Qualifications:** A slightly higher percentage of Manor Park residents have other qualifications (10.2%), when compared to Rushmoor as a whole (6.97%).



Level 1 qualifications cover: 1-4 O Levels/CSE/GCSEs (any grades), Entry Level, Foundation Diploma, NVQ level 1, Foundation GNVQ, Basic/Essential Skills.

Level 2 qualifications cover: 5+ O Level (Passes)/CSEs (Grade 1)/GCSEs (Grades A\*-C), School Certificate, 1 A Level/ 2-3 AS Levels/VCEs, Intermediate/Higher Diploma, Welsh Baccalaureate Intermediate Diploma, NVQ level 2, Intermediate GNVQ, City and Guilds Craft, BTEC First/General Diploma, RSA Diploma.

Level 3 Qualifications cover: 2+ A Levels/VCEs, 4+ AS Levels, Higher School Certificate, Progression/Advanced Diploma, Welsh Baccalaureate Advance Diploma, NVQ Level 3; Advanced GNVQ, City and Guilds Advanced Craft, ONC, OND, BTEC National, RSA Advanced Diploma.

Level 4 and above qualifications cover: Degree (BA, BSc), Higher Degree (MA, PhD, PGCE), NVQ Level 4-5, HNC, HND, RSA Higher Diploma, BTEC Higher level, Professional Qualifications (Teaching, Nursing, Accountancy).

Other Qualifications cover: Vocational/Work-related Qualifications, Foreign Qualifications(Not stated/ level unknown).



The Government's Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2019 provides a relative deprivation score for each small area in England, it covers a range of economic, social and housing issues. The overall score is calculated using data from seven domains. Most of indicator data has come from 2015 and 2016 and some of the data is from the 2011 Census. The Indices of Deprivation cover geographical areas that are called Lower-layer Super Output Area level (LSOA), of which there are 32,844 in the country. There are a total of 58 LSOAs in Rushmoor.

Unfortunately, LSOAs and the council's wards do not exactly line up. In Manor Park ward there are all or part of six LSOAs. The following map shows the number of the LSOAs in Manor Park ward and the approximate percentage of the LSOA in the ward. Each LSOA is ranked in order against all other LSOA in the country, where 1 is the most deprived and 32,844 is the least deprived.

Manor Park ward has no areas of multiple deprivation (in the 20% most deprived). LSOA 144 (which is mostly in Manor Park ward) has a pocket of deprivation for the Income, Crime and Living Environment domain. LSOA 145 (which is mostly in Rowhill ward) has a pocket of deprivation for the Income and Crime.
