



8.2 EXISTING HERITAGE TRAIL 1 – NORTH CAMP TRAIL

This trail mainly deals with the military heritage assets in North Camp, but crosses the Basingstoke Canal at the 'Iron Bridge' and continues along Queen's Avenue to include the Head Quarters 4<sup>th</sup> Division Complex and the Alexander Observatory. The trail then turns east following the northern boundary of Wellesley along Alison Road and Thornhill Road taking in the site of Buller Barracks and God's Acre. At the junction with Government Road the trail includes Clayton Barracks before turning away from Wellesley and heading back to North Camp following the route of the Basingstoke Canal.




### 8.3 EXISTING HERITAGE TRAIL 2 – CENTRAL EAST-WEST TRAIL

This trail starts at the car park north of the ‘Iron Bridge,’ then proceed east along the north bank of the Basingstoke Canal towards Ash Lock before turning west along Government Road and proceeding towards Gallwey Road, taking in Clayton Barracks before taking a detour through the Aldershot Military Cemetery. The trail re-joins Gallwey Road and continues along the ridge, joining Hospital Road and includes many important heritage assets such as Cambridge Military Hospital, Fitzwygram House, Mandora Officers Mess and the Royal Army Medical Corps Boer War Memorial. The trail then turns north at the junction with Queen’s Avenue. Along Queen’s Avenue the trail includes many important monuments and buildings such as Smith Dorrien House, Alexander Observatory and Head Quarters 4<sup>th</sup> Division Complex, before returning to the start at the ‘Iron Bridge.’





8.4 EXISTING HERITAGE TRAIL 3 – CENTRAL NORTH-SOUTH TRAIL

This trail starts at the car park north of the ‘Iron Bridge,’ then proceed south along Queen’s Avenue before turning west into Browning Barracks visiting Balloon Square. The trail then continues west along Alison Road, turning south and follows the route of Farnborough Road until it reaches the Wellington Statue and Garrison Church. Heading north towards Knollys Road the trail includes the Prince Consorts Library and Pediment Sculpture. The trail heads east along Knollys Road until it reaches the junction with Hospital Hill and Queen’s Avenue. Turning east along Pennefather’s Road, the trail includes the 1960s Montgomery Lines Mess, IRA Bomb Victims Memorial and Tumulus, before heading south towards the Montgomery Stone. The trail returns to its start along Queen’s Avenue.




8.5 EXISTING HERITAGE TRAIL 4 – SOUTH CAMP

This trail mainly deals with the military camp outside Wellesley to the south. The trail starts at the Prince Consorts Library then heads south out of Wellesley where it visits Wellington Statue and other heritage assets. It returns to Wellesley via Gunhill Road where it visits Gun Hill House, McGrigor Barracks and the Cambridge Military Hospital. The trail then turns west along Hospital Road, visiting the Gordon Oak, Smith Dorrien House, Maida Gymnasium and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division World War One Memorial, before returning to the start along Knollys Road.

### 8.6 PROPOSED HERITAGE TRAIL 5 – THE WELLESLEY HERITAGE TRAIL


This new trail is intended to include the heritage buildings and monuments within Wellesley and link into the four existing trails outlined on the previous pages.

The trail starts at the at Balloon Square, then heads along Queens Avenue to the Cammell Memorial and passes the Alexander Observatory. It then turns east along Alison Road to the Head Quarters 4<sup>th</sup> Division complex of buildings, taking in the 8<sup>th</sup> Division World War One Memorial, post office, stables, Military Police Barracks, Alison’s House and Cranbrook House. The trail the continues east towards Gods Acre, before turning towards Hospital Road wand the ridge. The trail turns west along Gallwey Road taking in Fitzwygram House, the Signalling School and Mandora Officers Mess.

It then moves towards the Cambridge Military Hospital complex of buildings. The trail then takes another slight detour to the south down Gun Hill to visit Royal Army Medical Corps Boer War Memorial, before returning to Hospital Road where it passes the Gordon Oak, Smith Dorrien House and Maida Gymnasium. The trail then enters the former Montgomery Lines area, visiting the Ramsden Wall Memorial, and taking slight detour north to take in the Band Practice Room and the Montgomery Stone. The trail then moves towards the Farnborough Road, visiting the Beresford Memorial, and then heading south to Pennefather’s Road. Here, the trail takes in the 1960s Montgomery Lines Mess, the IRA Bomb Victims Memorial and the Tumulus. It then heads west to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division World War One Memorial. The visitor can then carry on north up Queens Avenue, perhaps taking in the Stanhope Lines, before returning to the start point at Balloon Square.

## 9.0 BUILDING RECORDING

### 9.1 INTRODUCTION

In advance of development of each heritage asset, a strategy for the recording is required. It is anticipated that most building categories on the site will need to be recorded in some form because proposed development is likely to affect statutory heritage assets in their own right or other assets on land which has a statutory designation, for example, the Conservation Area.

The recording of heritage assets would be required in the following contexts:

- Demolition within a Conservation Area
- Demolitions/alterations and refurbishment to structures contained within curtilages of Listed Buildings
- Demolitions, alterations and refurbishments to statutorily Listed Structures
- Demolitions, alterations or refurbishments in relation to locally Listed Buildings or structures
- Removal/relocation of monuments or memorials.

The level and degree of recording required for each heritage asset, whether building or structure, is the subject of this section of the document. This section sets out a broad strategy for different classes of recording and the tables in the following pages establish which class is to be applied to each structure across Wellesley.

The intention is to provide an agreed format and structure for the recording of buildings across Wellesley, which can be applied in the later more detailed phases of work within individual phases of development. In doing so it is intended that an archive of records of all existing assets on the site will be collected and collated over the duration of the development of the site.

#### 9.1.1 PURPOSE OF RECORDING BUILDINGS

Records of historic buildings are compiled:

- *‘...to promote the understanding and appreciation of historic buildings, individually and collectively;*
- *to inform the day-to-day and long-term management and use of individual buildings;*
- *to secure an understanding of a building and its significance sufficient to inform the preparation of a scheme of conservation, repair or alteration, or decisions relating to such a scheme as part of the planning or conservation process;*
- *to document buildings, or parts of buildings, which may be lost as a result of demolition, alteration or neglect;*

- *to assess the significance of groups of buildings, settlements and landscapes, and provide a basis for strategic heritage management;*
- *to provide underpinning data for thematic, topographic or period-specific works of synthesis by recording a sample of surviving structures;*
- *to inform academic research across a range of disciplines;*
- *to deposit a permanent record in an established archive.’*

It should be borne in mind that:

- *‘A record should chart the historical development of the building or site, explaining and illustrating what is significant and providing dates for significant parts or phases of development wherever possible;*
- *A record should aim to be accurate, clear and concise;*
- *The scope and level of the record and its limitations should be stated;*
- *A record should make a clear distinction between observation and interpretation, thereby allowing data to be reinterpreted at a later date;*
- *Wherever practicable a record should take account of the site’s context, including its wider archaeology, known and potential, whether in terms of below-ground deposits or of landscape archaeology;*
- *a record should include an indication of any sources consulted;*
- *a record should identify its compilers and give the date of creation, and any subsequent amendments should be similarly endorsed;*
- *a record should seek to embody the benefits of peer review;*
- *the report and supporting material should be produced in a medium which can be copied easily and which ensures archival stability;*
- *a record should be made accessible through deposit in a permanent archive and signposting in a recognised internet finding aid.’*

Further:

*‘It is important that those creating a record should be mindful at all times of:*

- *the rights and sensitivities of owners and occupants;*
- *the health-and-safety implications of working in historic buildings.*

This document is not intended to be definitive. Circumstances will often arise when those involved with the care, repair or understanding of an historic

building require records with an emphasis or content which may differ from those described below. It is expected however, that the forms of record outlined here will fulfil the requirements of the majority of those for whom historical understanding is the principal objective.

#### 9.1.2 CONSULTATION AND GUIDANCE

Advice on the type of recording and the strategy was sought from form to Rushmoor Borough Council as part of the general consultation regarding the heritage strategy for the development of Wellesley. English Heritage guidance on recording buildings has also been referenced. *Understanding Historic Buildings: A Guide to Good Recording Practice* (2006), sets out methods and types of recording of historic buildings in order that we can better understand of such structures.

#### 9.1.3 PARAMETERS & CRITERIA FOR RECORDING BUILDINGS

The type of recording to be attributed to individual buildings and structures or to a group of structures depends on its significance. Levels of significance are attributed to assets according to a number of factors including:

- Statutory significance
- Architectural or aesthetic significance
- Significance of location or setting
- Practical significance

The significance of individual buildings and building groups has already been assessed in the detailed heritage area studies that comprise section 4 of this document.

## 9.2 TYPES OF RECORDING

Different levels of recording have been formulated in accordance with advice from Rushmoor Borough Council and using suggested guidance provided by English Heritage. Categories of recording from A-C set out below are intended to broadly reflect Levels 1-4 of English Heritage's advice and should be interpreted in that context.

At its simplest, Category C is a brief record of the building and would be applied to the least significance structures or buildings.

At its most detailed, Category A would provide the highest level of recording and would be applied to the most significant structures or buildings.

For all categories, any historic information discovered should be included. The information on individual buildings should also be accompanied by an overall description of the site and its historical development. In regard to foundation stones and plaques, these should all be recorded as part of the building to which they belong.

### CATEGORY C

Category C is essentially a basic visual record, supplemented by the minimum descriptive information needed to identify the building's location, age and type. This is the simplest record, typically undertaken when the objective is to gather basic information a building. Category C surveys will generally be of exteriors only, although they may include superficial interior inspection for significant features.

A Category C record will typically consist of:

- An outline of the building plan shown in relationship to its surroundings
- A photograph of the exterior
- A general building description and condition summary

This category of recording would apply to a high proportion of the typical 1960s barrack buildings intended to be removed.

### CATEGORY B

This is a descriptive and partially analytical record, made in circumstances similar to those of Category C, but when more information is needed. Both the exterior and the interior will be viewed, described and photographed. The record will comprise an introductory description followed by some account of the building's origins, development and use. It may also any include photographic records and plans that may be required to illustrate the building's appearance and structure. Information contained in the record will mostly have been obtained through an examination of the building itself and if documentary sources are used they are likely to be those which are most readily accessible, such as historic Ordnance Survey maps and other published sources.

A Category B record will typically consist of:

- An outline of the building plan shown in relationship to its surroundings
- Measured survey floor plans, including ceiling, window and door heights
- Photographs of each external elevation and typical internal photographs
- Photographs of any significant details
- A more detailed building description and condition summary

This would apply to slightly higher status 1960s buildings, which might have interesting internal features and all of the Victorian buildings due to be removed.

### CATEGORY A

Category A provides a comprehensive analytical record and is appropriate for buildings of special importance. All listed buildings and some locally listed and curtilage listed buildings would be recorded to this level of detail. Category A will draw on the full range of available archival resources, discuss in detail the building's origins, development and use, and analyse the building's significance in terms of architectural, social, regional or economic history. The detail of the survey drawings will also be greater than at other levels. The record will discuss the building's broader stylistic or historical context and importance.

A Category A record will typically consist of:

- Building plan shown in relationship to surrounding buildings.
- Full measured survey, including floor plans, all elevations and typical sections
- Photographs of each external elevation and internal photographs of every room
- Photographs of any significant details
- A detailed building description and condition survey

## 9.3 PROGRAMME OF RECORDING

A detailed programme for the recording of individual buildings would be established at the start of development of each heritage asset. In the case of buildings to be removed, building recording must be completed before demolition begins. Similarly, all Listed and Locally Listed buildings undergoing alterations and partial demolition must be recorded before any works commence.

### 9.4 DEPOSIT, DISSEMINATION & PUBLICATION

Information collated through the recording of buildings would be deposited in the Smith Dorrien Office at Wellesley and made available for public consultation. Building records may also be deposited in other local and national archives in the public domain as appropriate, to be agreed with Rushmoor Borough Council and/or MoD Estates Division if required.
